Pre-Assignment:

Please read Alister McGrath's *Reformation Thought* carefully with these questions in mind:

1. What theological emphases, positions, or controversies of the 16th Century European Reformation help me to understand my role and my church's role as bearers of the Gospel (i.e. evangelism) in the 21st Century? How?
2. What theological emphases, positions, or controversies of the 16th Century European Reformation help me understand aspects of my own church's worship in the 21st Century? How?
3. What theological emphases, positions, or controversies of the 16th Century European Reformation help me to think about my own life of prayer and my growing intimacy with God? How?

Write one short (600 word) essay for each of these questions. The point of this essay is not to be right, or to impress the instructor. The point is to help you begin to think about how what happened in the 16th Century has a bearing on your own life and ministry today. These essays will not be graded, though they should be written thoughtfully and carefully. They will be turned in on the first day of class.
