Field Education:

Two units of approved field education are required. They are here satisfied in student pastorates.

Evaluation

Three points of evaluation/self-evaluation occur. The first evaluation occurs after the second semester and it provides an early reading on the student's sense of vocation and direction. The second evaluation occurs at the end of year three. The third evaluation is the middler evaluation and it occurs in the second semester of the middler year.
