Notes:

XTIANEDU 80 counts as a *Church Ministries* Limited Elective.

XTIANEDU 175 will satisfy denominational requirements for a worship course in special circumstances (and replace the need for LTS 78).

XTIANEDU 205, Bible Study Programs for the Local Church, counts as a *Practicing Theology in Ministry* Limited Elective.

XTIANEDU elective can be taken earlier than the spring semester of the senior year if time allows.

†UM students are encouraged to consider which area they are most likely to desire further advanced coursework when deciding the order in which to take these three required electives.

Field Education:

Two units of approved field education are required; they may be academic year placements (30 weeks) or summer placements (10-12 weeks). At least one field education placement must be in a Christian education setting.

Evaluations

MDiv students matriculating before 2008 are required to complete a Middler Evaluation with a faculty member before registering for their senior year or last eight course credits. Successful completion of one unit of field education is necessary to complete the Middler Evaluation. Guidelines for completing the Middler Evaluation are described in the Academics section on the Divinity website.

MDiv students matriculating in 2008 or after are required to compile and submit a "portfolio" for review by a faculty member in the Middler and Senior Evaluations. The contents of the portfolio and timing of the evaluations are described in the Academics section on the Divinity website.

Timely completion of the appropriate evaluations is required to continue in the M.Div. degree program and for conferral of the M.Div. degree.
